Point of Information: M.A.T. Secondary Education in Wisconsin changes

The Secondary Education M.A.T. program in Wisconsin has reduced the number of hours for student teaching SEC 590A-E from 9 semester hours to 6 semester hours, effective Winter Quarter, 2006.

SEC 583F Workshop/SEC/Contemporary Issues/Environmental Education in the Classroom and SEC583A Workshop/SEC/ Contemporary Issues/Wisconsin Native American Issues have been changed from workshops to courses effective Winter Quarter 2006. The courses are:

SEC 520 Environmental Education in the Classroom: Contemporary Issues
SEC 521 Contemporary Wisconsin Native American Issues.

Rationale

The changes ensure that the Secondary Education M.A.T. program in Wisconsin is in alignment with the Secondary Education M.A.T. program in Illinois.
